Sermon Notes The Ascent Everlasting I Corinthians 15

MADISON, IN Rev. Collin & Nicole Welch – Madison Reformed Church

Greetings in the Name of Jesus Christ! This summer will mark our fourth year of church planting efforts here in the Ohio River Valley. In 2020 we began with three families, totaling 15 souls. We now have 50 in membership, which have come from near and far. In our one-room church rental our Lord's Day services are lively and the singing is loud.



Although some of our adult members had experience in Reformed churches in the past, none were born and baptized in them. The Heidelberg Catechism is therefore brand new to our covenant children and teens, over half of our membership. Those who have taken up the challenge of memorizing parts of the catechism have already begun to reap rewards. One new family couldn't believe how quickly their three children memorized Q&A 1 and were amazed to hear them reciting with the rest of our youth those blessed words, "That I am not my own..."



To encourage our youth and to help our families take first steps in catechesis, we held a Summer Catechism Challenge last summer. Different age groupings of the youth were assigned a number of Q&As. At the end of the summer, they recited several of them to me in person. The following Lord's Day, we held a celebration lunch at a nearby park and handed out certificates. It was a great day.

The last year has also seen new visitors, the result of our members faithfully engaging with people in our community throughout the week, hosting them at their homes, and inviting

them to church. So, over the last several months we've tried out short-term mid-week gatherings to provide opportunities for fellowship and to welcome new visitors. These included sermon discussion gatherings at local parks and pubs, where attendees discussed questions from the previous Sunday's sermons, as well as "Get to Know MRC" meetings to help new people understand the marks of our church without needing first to commit to membership classes.

In the midst of all these and many other happenings, the greatest joy is to see people lean on Christ, wait patiently on their heavenly Father, and bear the fruit of the Holy Spirit. Although midweek gatherings and summer challenges have been helpful and useful, these Triune graces are most evident in our Lord's Day assemblies. To God alone be the glory!
